NRC is in Syria to support people affected by forced displacement (IDPs, returnees, host community etc.) so that they can have access to timely and effective assistance, to cope with the crisis and when the crisis ends return and rebuild their lives. Since the start of its activities in mid-2016 in Syria, NRC has reached with humanitarian assistance more than 360,000 people, out of which more than 150,000 reached in 2018 alone in the Governorates of Damascus, Aleppo and Rural Damascus.

NRC will continue to apply an integrated programming approach, where Education, capacity building, Shelter/WASH, and Livelihoods & Food Security (LFS) programmes work jointly to enable displacement-affected populations to meet their basic needs, enjoy their rights, and benefit from pathways to durable solutions.

The purpose of the Capacity Building Technical Assistant position is to support the effective implementation of activities, in accordance with project documents and relevant NRC and donor guidelines.

- Implement project activities aligned with NRC strategies, ensuring high technical quality, including delivering information sessions and organizing and delivering training for local partners and stakeholders.
- Conduct field monitoring visits to engage stakeholders, support NRC field staff, and maintain program quality.
- · Mobilize and build the capacity of community focal points under NRC's area-based approach to service delivery.
- Share practical ideas for community engagement and identify opportunities for interventions, particularly in capacity building, service referrals, and information provision.
- Identify participants and venues for capacity-building activities and assist project participants in accessing rights through counseling and legal assistance.
- Provide support to NRC's integrated projects by contributing to beneficiary identification and activity selection criteria in collaboration with other program units.
- Represent NRC externally at the area level as delegated, maintaining frequent field presence and developing relationships with local stakeholders.
- Contribute to strategy development, project proposals, and assessments of needs and gaps while producing regular field reports on successes and challenges.
- Ensure compliance with NRC policies, including data management, monitoring, evaluation, and learning tools, while maintaining accurate records.
- Perform any other tasks relevant to the position as requested by the line manager.
